

### 2016 Annual Report

Milton E. Frech Jr., Chief of Police Bryan C. Brown, Assistant Chief Chief Milton Frech of the Brunswick Police Department respectfully submits this report as an overview of accomplishments and achievements from January 1, 2016 to December 31, 2016.

### 2016 Personnel:

In April 2016, the agency hired two lateral transfers. Officer Gary Cline retired from the Frederick County Sheriff's Office and Kevin Linehan joined our agency with experience from the University of Maryland Police Department. Recruit Joel Storms began his Brunswick career at the Frederick Police Academy on October 14, 2016 with a projected graduation date in May 2017 and lateral transfer, Keith Donovan, joined the agency in December 2016. There were three resignations during 2016 and the agency currently has two vacancies.

### 2016 Vehicles:

Two new vehicles were purchased in the spring of 2016. This was the first purchase of the Ford AWD Police Interceptor, with two additional Ford AWD vehicles budgeted in the FY17 budget. This allowed for the rotation of older, high mileage vehicles from the police fleet.

### 2016 Calls for Service:

During the 2016 calendar year, the Brunswick Police handled a total of 10,255 calls for service. In comparison, the Thurmont Police Department handled a total 12,482 calls for service in 2016.

650 calls required police reports and 141 were closed by arrest. 3,649 calls were self-initiated patrol checks of locations within the City and 6,606 calls for service originating from dispatch/citizens. In 2015, we received 11,297 calls for service originating from dispatch/citizens, a decrease of 4,691 in 2016.

### **2016 Grants:**

In 2016, the Brunswick Police received \$80,892.79 in grant funding. The grants were as follows:

### 2016 State Aid for Police Protection: \$64,936.00

The State Aid for Police Protection Fund is a formula-driven funding program used to supplement resources for police protection in local communities. State funds provide additional revenue to support the operational costs of local and county police agencies.

### 2016 State Homeland Security Program: \$7,756.79

The Brunswick Police Department purchased one mobile police radio, two portable radio batteries and a Dell mobile data terminal with this grant. The equipment was purchased and the grant was closed out in December 2016.

### 2016 Tobacco Grant: \$700.00

The Brunswick Police Department received a grant from the Frederick County Health Department for Tobacco Enforcement.

### 2016 Safe Streets Grant: \$5,000.00

The Brunswick Police Department partnered with the Frederick City Police Department to receive a grant from the Federal Safe Street Initiative. The grant is awarded to the Frederick City Police Department and portions are distributed to local agencies. The Brunswick Police Department was awarded \$5,000.

### 2016 NADDI Training Grant: \$2,500.00

The National Association of Drug Diversion Investigators (NADDI) is a non-profit 501(c)(3) organization that facilitates cooperation between law enforcement, healthcare professionals, state regulatory agencies, pharmaceutical manufacturers in the investigation and prevention of prescription drug abuse and diversion. The grant allowed four officers to attend 3 different drug diversion trainings. NADDI has a membership fee of \$50.00 and Chief Frech is a member.

### 2016 Training:

Officers attended 1,369 hours of training in 2016. Some of the training was related to:

### 2016 Drug Enforcement:

The national opioid epidemic has not overlooked Brunswick. The Brunswick Police Department shifted resources to combat the distribution and use of drugs in our community. In November 2016, K9 Trax joined the agency. Vehicle scans have resulted in the seizure of PCP and Heroin.

In 2016, the Brunswick Police executed 5 drug related Search and Seizure Warrants, resulting in 8 people being charged and the recovery of drugs and paraphernalia. This increase has been a result of an investigator position being staffed and dedicating their time to investigate complaints.

### 2016 Special Event Staffing:

The Brunswick Police continued to support local events in our community. Brunswick Police personnel adjusted their schedules to staff these special events without the expenditure of any overtime funding. The events included, but were not limited to, all Brunswick Main Street events, 4th of July Fireworks, BARC events and runs, Brunswick Railroad Days, Veterans Day Parade and Hometown Holidays.

### 2017 Goals:

For many years, the agency has experienced a high turnover rate of officers. My goal in the upcoming year is to work with the Mayor and Council to implement changes to reduce the loss of certified officers. The investigator position will dedicate his/her efforts in combating crime and drugs in our community. Customer service is important to our citizens and we will continue to strive to improve in this area.
