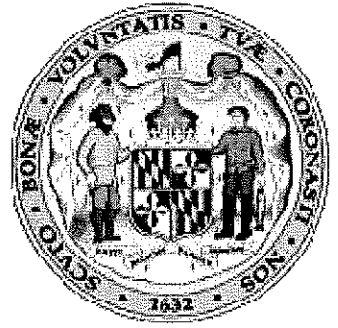
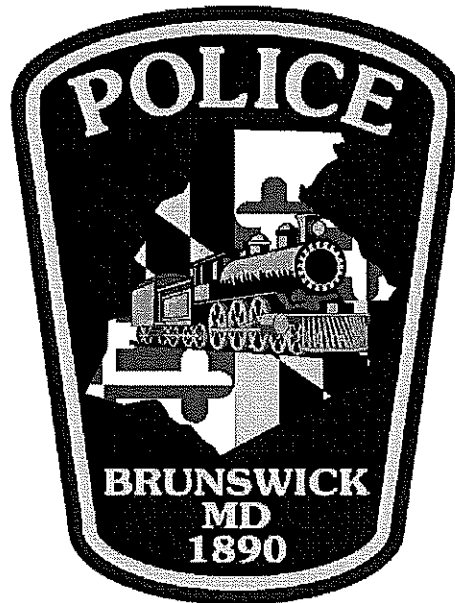

Chief Milton Frech of the Brunswick Police Department respectfully submits this report as an overview of accomplishments and achievements from January 1, 2017 to December 31, 2017.

2017 Personnel:

In March 2017, Officer Sean Linehan joined our agency after leaving the Montgomery County Sheriff's Office. In April 2017, Officer Joel Storms graduated the Frederick Police Academy and began his career. Retired Frederick County Sheriff Deputy Michael Eyler joined the Brunswick Police Department on January 1, 2018, bringing the agency to full staff.

2017 Vehicles:

Three new Ford AWD Police Utility SUV vehicles were ordered in the summer of 2017. One of these vehicles was outfitted as a K9 vehicle in November 2017.

2017 Calls for Service:

During the 2017 calendar year, the Brunswick Police handled a total of 12,129 calls for service, an increase of 1,874 calls for service from 2016. In comparison, the Thurmont Police Department handled a total 11,330 calls for service in 2017.

4,647 calls were self-initiated patrol checks of locations, 1,234 were traffic stops and 6,248 calls for service originated from dispatch/citizens. Of the 6,248 calls for service, 838 calls required police reports.

2017 Grants:

In 2017, the Brunswick Police received \$86,499.00 in grant funding. The grants were as follows:

2017 State Aid for Police Protection: \$65,000.00

The State Aid for Police Protection Fund is a formula-driven funding program used to supplement resources for police protection in local communities. State funds provide additional revenue to support the operational costs of local and county police agencies.

2017 State Homeland Security Program: \$10,337.00

The Brunswick Police Department purchased one mobile police radio, two E-Tix scanner/printers, five Motorola radio batteries and two Panasonic CF53 laptops. The equipment was purchased and the grant was closed out in December 2017.

2017 Tobacco Enforcement Grant: \$750.00

The Brunswick Police Department received funding from the Frederick County Health Department for tobacco enforcement.

2017 Alcohol Enforcement Grant: \$750.00

The Brunswick Police Department received funding from the Frederick County Health Department for alcohol enforcement.

2017 Safe Streets Grant: \$7,162.00

The Brunswick Police Department partnered with the Frederick City Police Department to receive a grant from the Federal Safe Street Initiative. The grant was awarded to the Frederick City Police Department with portions distributed to local agencies.

2017 Training:

Officers attended 1765 hours of training in 2017. Some of the training was related to:

2017 Drug Enforcement:

Drug enforcement took a huge step forward in 2017 with the creation of an investigator position to handle all drug complaints and overdose cases. In 2017, Detective Jesson obtained 16 search and seizure warrants, as compared to five for the agency in 2016. Jesson's search warrants resulted in 20 people arrested for narcotic violations, while seizing \$15,537.00 in US currency, seven firearms and one vehicle. Two additional search and seizure warrants were obtained for cellular telephones related to overdose cases.

In 2017, Officer Smith and K9 Trax conducted 27 vehicle sniffs and assisted the Sheriff's Office with scans of the Brunswick Schools. Several of the sniffs resulted in the arrest of the occupants after the seizure of heroin and/or cocaine. The seizures were a direct result of the K9 scans.

In November 2017, Trax attended a certification training to conduct searches for lost articles and/or missing people. This has added an additional resource for these types of incidents. Trax also attended monthly narcotic certification trainings.

In 2017, the Brunswick Police responded to 19 overdoses, one resulting in a fatality. Brunswick officers administered Narcan eight times on seven individuals. Seven other individuals received Narcan from EMS. The Brunswick Police Narcan deployments were as follows:

2017 Special Event Staffing:

The Brunswick Police continued to support local events in our community. This was the first year for Kids, Cops and Canoes in which six Brunswick Police Officers and School Resource Deputy Sidow were paired with local children to spend a day canoeing on the Potomac River. This was a collaborative effort with River and Trail, who provided a guide and all of the required equipment. Kids, Cops and Canoes allowed our local youth an opportunity to spend time with a police officer in a non-enforcement setting, in hopes of building positive relationships.

The Brunswick Police Department participated in the Optimist Club Fish-with-a-COP program, held in June, and the December Shop-with-a-COP. Two Brunswick Officers volunteered for each event and spent time with local children from our community.

For the second straight year, officers requested to partake in a No Shave November activity. Officers, volunteering to donate a predetermined "fee", were allowed to maintain a neatly groomed beard. The money collected was donated to the Brunswick Food Bank.

Brunswick Police Department supported many of the City of Brunswick events. The events included, but were not limited to, all Brunswick Main Street events, 4th of July Fireworks, BARC events, Brunswick Railroad Days, Veterans Day Parade and Hometown Holidays.

2018 Goals:

Improving retention has been one my goals since joining the Brunswick Police Department in 2007. 2017 ushered in many improvements in pay and benefits, thanks to a supportive Mayor and Council. This has made a positive impact on the officers and on January 1, 2018, the Brunswick Police Department was fully staffed for the first time in recent memory. I am very grateful, and this should have a positive impact on the Brunswick Police Department as the agency and community continues to grow.

The Brunswick Police Department plans to continue an aggressive enforcement approach to our opioid crisis and illegal narcotic activities. As always, Captain Brown and I continue to seek ways to improve our agency's customer service abilities, and are always available to meet with any citizen for any reason.
